I. Call to Order, Welcome, Pledge and Prayer

Mayor Miller called to order the Regular Council Meeting of the Stanford City Council at 6:30 pm on Thursday March 12th, 2026. All recited the pledge to the U.S. Flag after which Councilman Ronnie Deatherage opened the meeting with prayer.

II. Roll Call

A roll call was conducted with the following members present: Eddie Carter, Ronnie Deatherage, Jason Hignite, Bill Miracle, Joe Tackett and Jerry Wilkinson. A quorum was declared by the Mayor.

Also present were: Police Chief Zach Middleton and County Attorney John Hackley.

III. Approval of Minutes

After consultation with KLC and review of our City ordinance by Attorney John Hackley, it was determined that the yearly CPI adjustment moving forward can be stacked for both the City Council and the Mayor. The adjustment will be made looking back to January 1, 2026 and moving forward.

-Jenny Ralston Maloney is now actively working as our Stanford/Lincoln County Chamber of Commerce Director and has several exciting events in the works including a Musicfest on May 16th as well as a Farmer's Market on the 1st Thursday of every month beginning June 4th.

-Spring Cleanup is set to begin April 13th and run through the 17th with Main Street Cleansweep happening on April 18th from 9-noon.

-The June Shred event will be June 6th from 9 to noon in front of the courthouse.


-The oil change business on Old Fort Rd. has been purchased and is now operating as Summit Oil Express. They are planning to open in May.

VIII. Adjourn




