Stanford City Council Regular Council Meeting Lincoln County Public Library Meeting Room 6:30 pm, April 10th, 2025

I. Call to Order, Welcome, Pledge and Prayer

Mayor Miller called to order the Regular Council Meeting of the Stanford City Council at 6:30 pm on Thursday, April 10th, 2025. All recited the pledge to the U.S. Flag after which Councilman Joe Tackett opened the meeting with prayer.

II. Roll Call

A roll call was conducted with the following members present: Eddie Carter, Ronnie Deatherage, Jason Hignite, Bill Miracle, Joe Tackett and Jerry Wilkinson. A quorum was declared by the Mayor.

Also present were: Police Chief Zach Middleton, Fire Chief Scott Maples, and City Attorney John Hackley.

III. Approval of Minutes

Motion was made by Councilman Wilkinson (2nd by Councilman Carter) to approve the minutes from the March 13th, 2025, Regular City Council Meeting as presented. All in favor, motion carried.

IV. Citizen's Comments

There were no citizen's comments.

V. Council Comments

Councilman Jason Hignite presented a request from Sgt. Michael Mullins with the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office. Sgt. Mullins K9 will be retiring this year. The cost of a new K9 will be \$13,500. Sgt. Mullins has currently raised \$10,000 of this cost. Councilman Hignite proposed that we assist with the additional \$3,500, as the dog will also be available to be used here within the city limits of Stanford. Mayor Miller shared that he believes we can use the Opioid Abatement Funds for this purchase and the amount can be added into the new budget to assist with the purchase as we have those funds available.

Motion was made by Councilman Hignite (2nd by Councilman Carter) to designate \$3,500 from the Opioid Abatement Funds to assist with the purchase price of the new K9 for handler Sgt. Michael Mullins with the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office in the 2025/2026 budget. All in favor, motion carried.

Councilman Carter asked if the mirror behind Coleman's is going to be replaced. Chief Middleton will be ordering a new mirror to replace the one that is missing.

VI. Presentation of Proposed Asphalt Resurfacing Project for Spring 2025 (Opportunity for Public Comment) The list of streets being considered for the 2025 Spring Asphalt Resurfacing Project was presented and the floor was opened for discussion. Citizen Pam Cox expressed her appreciation for her street being added to this year's planned project. There were no citizens present and no additional comments presented.

VII. Presentation of Bids for 2025 Spring Asphalt Resurfacing Project (see attached log)

Mayor Miller shared that four bids were submitted for this year's paving project. The advertisement for bid was published in the April 3, 2025, Interior Journal and bids were due by 4:30pm on April 10, 2025. Work is to be completed by June 30, 2025. Each bid was opened and the totals were tallied (see attached

log sheet). Bids were received from The Allen Company, Harmon Paving, Crossroads Paving, LLC, and J&S Asphalt.

VIII. Possible Motion to Award 2025 Spring Resurfacing Project

After some discussion concerning the possibility of breaking up the bids, and the work done for the city by the various vendors, a motion was made by Councilman Deatherage (2nd by Councilman Carter) to accept the low bid that was presented by The Allen Company. All in favor, motion carried.

IX. Presentation of Resolution No. 2025-0410 A Resolution of the City of Stanford Authorizing the Operation of Street-Legal Special Purpose Vehicles on Designated Public Roadways Within the City Limits of Stanford Pursuant to Senate Bill 63

Councilman Carter (2nd by Councilman Miracle) made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2025-0410 Authorizing the Operation of Street-Legal Special Purpose Vehicles on Designated Public Roadways Within the City Limits of Stanford Pursuant to Senate Bill 63. A roll call vote was taken with all in favor, resolution was adopted.

X. Presentation of Annual 2025/2026 Budget Proposal and Message from the Mayor

Mayor Miller presented to the council an excel spreadsheet outlining the proposed income and expenses by line item for all departments within the City of Stanford.

Chief Middleton explained the implementation of a step raise program for the police officers. This will recognize the officers longevity with the department by increasing their hourly wage to coincide with each additional year of service.

XI. Possible 1st Reading of Ordinance No. 2025-0410 City of Stanford Budget Ordinance 2025/2026 Fiscal Year

Councilman Deatherage (2nd by Councilman Miracle) made a motion to entertain the 1st reading of Ordinance No. 2025-0410 City of Stanford Budget Ordinance 2025/2026 Fiscal Year. All in favor, motion carried. City Attorney John Hackley made the 1st reading.

XII. Possible 1st Reading of Ordinance 920.44 Adoption of Text Amendment by Recommendation of Planning and Zoning Commission to Section 661, 662, 663, 664, 671, 672 and 673 Concerning Livestock and Poultry

A recommendation was received from the Planning and Zoning committee to amend the current Planning and Zoning Ordinance sections as referenced above concerning livestock and poultry within the City limits.

A motion was made by Councilman Miracle (2nd by Councilman Deatherage) to entertain the 1st reading of Ordinance 920.44 an Ordinance of the City of Stanford, Kentucky Amending Zoning Ordinance 920.27 Sections 661, 662, 663, 664, 671, 672 and 673 Concerning Livestock or Poultry. All in favor, motion carried. City Attorney John Hackley made a summary reading of Ordinance 920.44.

XIII. Possible 1st Reading of Ordinance 920.45 Adoption of Text Amendment by Recommendation of Planning and Zoning Commission to Section 990 Concerning Recreational Vehicles

A recommendation was received from the Planning and Zoning committee to amend the current Planning and Zoning Ordinance sections as referenced above concerning transient recreational vehicle use within the City limits.

A motion was made by Councilman Deatherage (2nd by Councilman Carter) to entertain the 1st reading of Ordinance 920.45 an Ordinance of the City of Stanford, Kentucky Amending Zoning Ordinance 920.27 Section 990 Concerning Transient Recreational Vehicles. All in favor, motion carried. City Attorney John Hackley made a summary reading of Ordinance 920.45.

XIV. Presentation of Municipal Road Aid Resolution for the 2025/2026 Budget Year

Mayor Miller presented a resolution adopting and approving the execution of a Municipal Road Aid Co-Op Program Contract beginning July 1, 2025. A motion was made by Councilman Miracle (2nd by Councilman Carter) to adopt the MRA Resolution. All in favor, motion carried. The 2025-2026 mutual road aid agreement totals \$85,094.63.

XV. Mayor's Information to Council
