Stanford City Council Regular Council Meeting Lincoln County Public Library Meeting Room 6:30pm, August 10th, 2023

I. Call to Order, Welcome, Pledge and Prayer

Mayor Miller called to order the Regular Council Meeting of the Stanford City Council at 6:32pm on Thursday, August 10th, 2023. All recited the pledge to the U.S. Flag after which Councilman Jerry Wilkinson opened the meeting in prayer.

II. Roll Call

A roll call was conducted with the following members present: Eddie Carter, Ronnie Deatherage, Jason Hignite, Joe Tackett and Jerry Wilkinson. Absent was Bill Miracle. A quorum was declared by the Mayor.

Also present were: City Attorney John Hackley, Police Chief Zach Middleton, Officer Preston Middleton & Greyson, Captain Ryan Kirkpatrick and Chief Scott Maples.

III. Approval of Minutes

Motion was made by Councilman Wilkinson (2nd by Councilman Tackett) to approve the minutes from the July 13th, 2023 Regular City Council Meeting as written. All in favor, motion carried.

IV. Citizen's Comments

There were no citizen's comments.

V. Council Comments

Councilman Wilkinson asked if the safety concern on the sidewalk at Save a lot was being addressed. Mayor Miller shared that it has been escalated to a safety concern with the state and they are going to address it.

Councilman Carter asked if we received a good bid for the Foster Lane Sidewalk Project. Mayor Miller stated that as far as he knows it did meet all the parameters.

VI. Resolution 2023-0810 Declaring a Police Canine as Surplus and Authorizing His Disposition to Officer Preston Middleton

A resolution was presented to council on behalf of the Stanford Police Department as it retired Canine Officer Nico after over seven (7) years of service. This resolution releases Nico to his handler, Officer Preston Middleton, for the remainder of Nico's life.

Officer Middleton and his son Greyson were present and expressed their thanks for the opportunity not only to work with Nico, but to continue the bond they have established over the last seven plus years as they continue to care for him.

Motion was made by Councilman Hignite (2nd by Councilman Tackett) to accept the resolution as presented. All in favor, resolution is accepted.

VII. Possible 1st Reading of Ordinance T2023 Ordinance Setting 2023 City of Stanford Rates on Real & Personal Property

Printouts were given to the council members showing the breakdown increase. The increase calls for a \$1.00 increase per \$100,000 of property value. This increase was built into the approved 2023-2024 budget.

Motion was made by Councilman Carter (2nd by Councilman Tackett) to have the 1st reading of Ordinance T2023 Ordinance Setting 2023 City of Stanford Rates on Real & Personal Property. All in favor, motion carried. 1st Reading was made by City Attorney Hackley.

VIII. Possible 2nd Reading of Amendment to Ordinance 2022-0512A City of Stanford Budget Ordinance 2022/2023 Fiscal Year

Motion was made by Councilman Wilkinson (2nd by Councilman Hignite) to have the 2nd reading of Amendment to Ordinance 2022-0512A City of Stanford Budget Ordinance 2022/2023 Fiscal Year. All in favor, motion carried. 2nd reading was made by City Clerk Jone Allen.

Motion was made by Councilman Hignite (2nd by Councilman Wilkinson) to accept the 2nd reading of Amendment to Ordinance 2022-0512A City of Stanford Budget Ordinance 2022/2023 Fiscal Year. All in favor, motion carried.

IX. Review of Ordinance 520.7 Bicycle, Skateboard and Horse Ordinance at the request of Councilman Wilkinson

A concern was presented by Councilman Wilkinson at last month's council meeting concerning children riding bicycles on city sidewalks. He requested a review of the existing ordinance and offers this new option. After discussion concerning motorized wheelchairs and children's toys, additional exceptions were added by Attorney Hackley.

Motion was made by Councilman Wilkinson (2nd by Councilman Carter) to have the 1st Reading with amendments of Ordinance 520.7 Ordinance of the City of Stanford, Kentucky Concerning Modes of Travel on City Sidewalks. All in favor, motion carried. 1st reading was made by City Attorney Hackley.

X. Resolution 2023-0810 Water Section 3 Action Plan

This is another piece of paperwork required to complete the application for the Sewer Rehabilitation Grant the Water Department is currently applying for. Mayor Miller read the resolution.

Motion was made by Councilman Hignite (2nd by Councilman Tackett) to accept the resolution as written.

All in favor, motion carried.

XI. Request for Purchase of Tractor

Mayor Miller presented a request to the council for the purchase of a new tractor for the street department. The current tractor (a 2009 model) is not large enough to complete all the work it is being called on to do. Three tractors of comparable size were looked at. We have the opportunity to purchase a 75hp John Deere under state contract with a bucket for \$57,804.76 that should last the city for at least 25 years. They are also offering a \$7-7,500 trade in of our current tractor. This will also allow us to remove and clear debris without having to call a contractor. Additional attachments can be purchased as well including a bush hog arm. We have all but \$700-800 currently approved in the 2023-2024 budget for new equipment. This request is being presented because of the projected overage.

After some discussion motion was made to approve the purchase of the John Deere Tractor by Councilman Tackett (2nd by Councilman Wilkinson). All in favor, motion carrier.

XII. Mayor's Information to Council

-Mayor Miller wished to express his thanks to Code Enforcement Officer Jeff Knouse for all the additional work he has put in over the past months in supplying developers with information concerning site development, zoning and code compliance. Also, thank you to the Planning and Zoning Board, their Attorney Joseph Vanhook and the Board of Adjustments. The Planning and Zoning Board along with their Attorney are currently updating their guidelines, which is a large undertaking.
